Initiative Overview

Pantoro Gold partnered with Teach Learn Grow (TLG) to advance foundational education in remote communities. TLG's established model delivers targeted, school-based interventions that complement the Western Australian curriculum, while Pantoro's funding and industry expertise help scale and sustain these programs. Together, the organisations aim to foster student confidence, improve academic outcomes and ignite early interest in resource sector careers. This initiative forms part of Pantoro's broader sustainability goals to invest in local talent and strengthen social licence to operate by enhancing student learning and career readiness.

Program Design and Delivery

TLG delivers two intensive, week-long programs each year in the Goldfields region. Each deployment comprises:

- Small-group literacy and numeracy workshops tailored to classroom needs
- Hands-on STEM activities designed by TLG and Pantoro technical specialists
- One-on-one and group mentoring sessions facilitated by trained volunteers

Pantoro's role includes ongoing financial support, provision of branded materials, and expert guest presentations from site-based professionals. TLG handles all operational logistics, volunteer coordination and liaises directly with school leadership to ensure alignment with curriculum standards.

This partnership advances Pantoro's sustainability objectives by cultivating a pipeline of locally sourced talent and reinforcing community resilience. Early evaluations report a 25 percent increase in student engagement and marked improvements in classroom participation. Annual impact reports track key metrics: tutoring hours, skill gains, teacher feedback, to guide continuous enhancement. By embedding education initiatives within its broader community investment framework, Pantoro demonstrates responsible mining practice and long-term commitment to regional development.

Program Timeline and Implementation

Applications open on 17 October 2025, with selection coordinated between Pantoro and the WA Mining Club to ensure recipients meet academic and industry-readiness criteria. Looking ahead, Pantoro and TLG will extend the program to additional Goldfields schools, introduce career-pathway workshops linking classroom learning to mining roles, and establish a mentor alumni network to sustain peer support. These steps will deepen educational impact, strengthen regional partnerships, and help secure Western Australia's future mining workforce.
